The CEFR describes what a learner is supposed to be able to do in **reading**, **listening**, **speaking and writing** at each level.

Required for January entrance to Grade 7	Completed A1	 Can understand and use familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases aimed at the satisfaction of needs of a concrete type. Can introduce self and others and can ask and answer questions about personal details such as where he/she lives, people he/she knows and things he/she has. Can interact in a simple way provided the other person talks slowly and clearly and is prepared to help.
Required for acceptance into Grade 8	Completed A2	 Can understand sentences and frequently used expressions related to areas of most immediate relevance (e.g. very basic personal and family information, shopping, local geography, employment). Can communicate about simple and routine tasks requiring a simple and direct exchange of information on familiar and routine matters. Can describe in simple terms aspects of his/her background, immediate environment and matters in areas of immediate need.
Required for acceptance into Grade 9	Completed B1	 Can understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered at home, school, leisure, etc. Can deal with most situations likely to arise whilst travelling in an area where the language is spoken. Can produce simple connected text on topics which are familiar or of personal interest. Can describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes & ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.
Required for acceptance into Grade 10	Developing B2	 Can understand the main ideas of complex text on both concrete and abstract topics, including discussions in regard to academic study. Can interact with a degree of fluency and spontaneity that makes regular interaction with native speakers quite possible without strain for either party. Can produce clear, detailed text on a wide range of subjects and explain a viewpoint on a topical issue giving the advantages and disadvantages of various options.
Required for acceptance into Grade 11 and Grade 12	Mastered B2 Proficient in C1 by March 31st	 Can understand a wide range of demanding, longer texts, and recognize implicit meaning. Can express self fluently and spontaneously without much obvious searching for expressions. Can use language flexibly and effectively for social, academic and professional purposes. Can produce clear, well-structured, detailed text on complex subjects, showing controlled use of organizational patterns, connectors and cohesive devices.
